
CETPartnership Joint Call 2023 Transnational & national guidelines



Joint Call 2023 overview

- A total Call budget of over € 127 million from almost 50
 national/regional Funding Organisations plus additional funding
 from the European Commission
- Funding Organisations fund entities based in their country/region and make funding arrangements directly with project partners in funded projects.
- Different Funding Organisations have different national/regional requirements and fund different Call Modules, see Annex C.

Partner(s)

- A project consortium may consist of the following legal entities:
 - A Coordinator: cannot be changed before the funding decision
 - Beneficiary Partners: participating with funding from the Call
 - Self-financed Partner(s): participating without applying for funding in the Call, but with a Letter of Commitment (submitted at the full proposal stage in the Call)
- Associated Project Partner(s) may participate without declaring their costs, nor applying for funding in the Call
- Specific Call Module and/or national/regional requirements may apply
- Minor changes in the project consortium may be accepted between the pre-proposal and the full proposal (see Subsection 6.2.1)



Eligibility criteria/requirements

Both pre-proposals and full proposals will be assessed according to:

- Transnational eligibility criteria (see Chapter 4) by the Call Management
- Call Module requirements (see Chapter 8) by TRIs
- National/regional requirements (separate submission may be needed, see Annex B) by the Funding Organisations



Transnational eligibility criteria

- 1 Submission on **CETPartnership Submission Platform** before **deadlines** using **templates**
- 2 ≥3 independent entities applying for funding from ≥3 countries participating in the Call (≥2 EU Member States or Horizon Europe Associated Countries)
- 3 Maximum 60% of the total project efforts (PMs) for one Project Consortium Partner
- 4 Maximum 75% of the total project efforts (PMs) from one country/region
- 5 Not from the CETPartnership members/Funding Organisations
- 6 Project start before 15 December 2024
- 7 Project duration 36 months maximum
- 8 Work package called Reporting and Knowledge Community included



Proposal submission

- Transnational submission on the <u>Submission Platform</u>
 - Pre-proposal stage (Stage 1): from a project consortium to one Call Module
 - Full proposal stage (Steg 2): from an invited project consortium to the same Call Module

National/regional submission

Some national/regional
 Funding Organisations require additional submission on national/regional level, see
 Annex B



CETPartnership Joint Call 2023 Proposal evaluation



Proposal evaluation

- Performed for proposals fulfilling all the transnational eligibility criteria and Call Module requirements
- Performed by at least three independent evaluators according to the evaluation criteria:
 - Excellence (score 0, 1, 2, 3, 4 or 5)
 - Impact (score 0, 1, 2, 3, 4 or 5)
 - Quality and efficiency of the implementation (score 0, 1, 2, 3, 4 or 5)
- Has the cut-off at a score of <10 in total and <3 for each criterium</p>
- Results in one ranking list per Call Module



Excellence

- Clarity and pertinence of the project's objectives, and the extent to which the proposed work is ambitious, and goes beyond the state-of-the-art.
- Soundness of the proposed methodology, including the underlying concepts, models, assumptions, inter-disciplinary approaches, appropriate consideration of the gender dimension in research and innovation content, and the quality of open science practices, including sharing and management of research and innovation outputs and engagement of citizens, civil society and end users where appropriate.



Impact

- Likely scale and significance of the expected outcomes and impacts including the added value of the transnational collaboration, and credibility of the pathways to achieve the expected outcomes and impacts specified in the work programme.
- Suitability and quality of the measures to maximise expected outcomes and impacts, as set out in the dissemination and exploitation plan, including communication activities.
- Extent to which the project is relevant for the energy transition through appropriate involvement of end-users, need-owners and/or the private sector.




Quality and efficiency of the implementation

- Quality and effectiveness of the work plan, assessment of risks, and appropriateness of the effort assigned to work packages and the resources overall.
- Capacity and role of each participant, and extent to which the consortium as a whole brings together the necessary expertise.

- 2. Is there any further assessment by the national funding, when a full proposal is selected by CETP?
- 3. Is there any limit on the total budget of a project?
- 4. Can German subsidiary of a company that is established in an Asian country that is not HE associated, participate in this call as a "beneficiary partner"?
- 5. Do we have to be employed (in our host institute) in the time of application? Or is it enough to get employed at the starting time of the project?





- 6. Is it possible that a collaborative partner is a European based branch (e. g. a GmbH) of an Asian based corporation?
- 7. What kind of commitment a "non- research organization" partner has to consortium/partnership?
- 8. What are typical consortium sizes and total project budget?
- 9. Can two organisations from the same EU country participate in the call together, assuming the consortia obeys the other transnational eligibility criteria?
- 10. My University is in Germany do I have the right to apply for a project?
- 11. Is It mandatory to have Self-financed partners in the project?





- 12. What are requirements for non-EU countries to be part of consortium, can member from non-EU country ask for budget if becomes part of consortium?
- 13. Would it be suitable to present a project (improved) presented in the 2022 call that passed the pre-proposal but was then not financed?
- 14. Can an organization from non-EU States (e.g., Scotland and US) coordinate a project?
- 15. Will we receive any comments on proposal, if rejected?
- 16. Can we change (add/withdraw/change) the partners of a consortium from the short proposal to the long proposal as long as the project remains the same?





- 17. Are there any requirements on the number of non-research partners in a consortium?
- 18. Can one participate in more than one applications?
- 19. Are any of the African countries considered as Associate too?
- 20. For Swedish funding organization (SWEA) you have to have an "end user" parter. What responsibility this partner have? Any financial commitments?
- 21. If an organization got a project in the last call, could this organization participate as partner in this call?
- 22. The participation of 2 companies is absolutely necessary in Norwegian participation?
